

## NH Philharmonic Presents Holiday Pops

MANCHESTER -- The New Hampshire Philharmonic kicks off the holiday season with its annual holiday pops concert. Concertgoers can step into the holiday season with an evening of pleasing musical chestnuts. The concert will take place on Saturday, November 26 at 7:30 pm in Derry's renowned Stockbridge Theatre.

Regional journalist Amy Covenov hosts the festivities. Well-known for her role as weekend news anchor at WMUR Channel 9, Ms. Covenov will be providing engaging commentary on the pieces performed throughout the evening.

The evening provides an international musical tour of holiday favorites. The first half is oriented towards light classical works, and the second half is devoted to pops favorites. The first half of the festive evening includes Sleigh Ride by New England native Leroy Anderson, classic scenes from Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker, and choral selections from the Messiah by George Frederick Handel.

The concert will be conducted by the Philharmonic's Music Director Anthony Princiotti. Princiotti commented on the program. "The Philharmonic's Pops concerts have always been not only an important part of our concert seasons, but indeed a crucial element of the organization's mission, which is to connect people to the power and beauty of the music. We play and present it in a way that makes its universality clear."

Massed choruses from both Pinkerton Academy and Timberlane Regional High School will join the Philharmonic in the first half for choral selections from the Messiah, and return in the second half for a medley of light-hearted Christmas pops songs. The Pinkerton Academy Chorale is being prepared for the concert by Thomas Quigley and Sandra Clark. Small choirs from both schools will also perform a cappella selections in the lobby before the concert and at intermission. The choristers from Timberlane are being prepared by Robert

Harrington. After intermission, the second half of the program will open with the white-hot Brazilian Sleighbells, plus the all-time American favorite White Christmas by Irving Berlin. Included in the evening is the ever-popular Carol Sing-along.

Concertgoers are advised to secure their tickets early, as last year's concert sold out well in advance. The Philharmonic's Executive Director Paul Hoffman noted about the venue choice, "We're so pleased to return to the Stockbridge Theatre. It's a beautiful, modern hall with clear sightlines and fine acoustics. A real gem."

The concert takes place on Saturday, November 26 (7:30 pm) at the Stockbridge Theatre at Pinkerton Academy, Derry. Tickets range in price from \$15 to \$50 and are available through the Stockbridge box office at 437 5210. Robin Dinda earned degrees from Davidson College, The University of Cincinnati, and The University of Michigan, and holds the Fellowship Certificate of The American Guild of Organists. As an organist he has performed across the United States, at many national and regional con-

ventions, and is particularly known for his performances of American organ music and his own many published compositions. During 1989-1999, he was Music Director at The First Church, Nashua. He is Professor of Humanities (Music) at Fitchburg State University in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, where he has taught since 1989.

Renea Waligora received the Bachelor of Arts degree from Carthage College and the Master of Music degree from the University of Michigan. Ms. Waligora has

performed at several national conventions of The Organ Historical Society, The International Society of Organ Builders and the American Theatre Organ Society. She has appeared at Methuen Memorial Music Hall, Trinity Church Boston, The Old West Series, All Saint's Worcester and many other venues throughout the United States. Currently, she serves as Director of Music at The United Church of Christ in Keene, NH and is the Dean of the Monadnock Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.
