## Mont Vernon Historical Society

### Museum Open August 4 & 18

The Mont Vernon Historical Society Museum will be open August 4 & 18, then again on the first and third Saturdays in September and October from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. This year a new display focuses on elections prior to 1960, this would be for the John F. Kennedy/Richard M. Nixon race and earlier, and also shows items relating to New Hampshire state and local elections. Of particular interest is a display of political license plates loaned by Mont Vernon resident Gerry Griffin. The exhibit will be held through October. Another new display this year features the Daland Memorial Library. The Arts and Crafts style building has served the Mont Vernon community since 1909.

Permanent displays include memorabilia from the Grand Hotel and Lamson Farm. A row of Dut-

ton clocks line a wall in the center space. The post office window and some of the boxes found a home in the museum when the new post office on Grand Hill Road opened in 1995. You might ask to see a sample of Boston Tea Party tea and ask how it came to be in the museum. A lovely King's Daughters' quilt given to the historical society when the organization disbanded includes a square that's over 150 years old. A small library holds a wide variety of books that may be looked at, unless too fragile, while visiting the museum. Admission is free. The museum, located on the second floor of the Town Hall, opened in 1990.

"There's nothing like church," she says. "You are accepted for you, you won't be turned away, and you don't age out." "It is the best source of community. I think peo-

ple are missing something without church." She continues, "I truly believe that you need God in our life and the community."

Judie was pleased to discover that two members of the congregation have trained 60-70 hours in the Stephen Ministry. They will train members of the congregation to also be caregivers (50 hours) who will then be caregivers to members of the community in need.

"I want people to know the church is here. We are vital and have an open door policy. I truly feel called to this church from the beginning. My husband and I sat in our car in the fire department parking lot across the street from the church and just looked at the church. I knew then I was called," she says.

She will be in her office on Thursdays, 10:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. Stop by and say hello. Judie is quick with a smile and has a warm sense of humor.

On Sunday, August 12 at 11 a.m. outside the church, there will be a blessing of the animals open to all the community. And ice cream for the pets.

He has demonstrated a strong interest learning basic first aid and rescue, and is an upstanding young man who will represent our country well at this international competition and rally. "Our Young Rescuers USA team learn and compete in basic life safety competitions, enjoy excursions to cultural, scenic, and historic sites throughout Belarus and make lasting international friendships," concluded Lt. Young Rescuers USA is a private non-profit that provides a program for young people that builds character, teaches basic first aid and emergency training and life saving skills, develops international understanding, cooperation and friendship, and develops personal fitness. The Young Rescuers USA team consists of seven members selected on a competitive basis to represent the USA at the International Rally of Young Rescuers. This program is available for 7 youth between the ages of 13 to 17. Full and partial scholarships for this program are available on a limited and competitive basis. The International Rally of Young Rescuers is held annually at Lake Narooh in the Republic of Belarus. Over fifteen countries have participated in this annual competition including Belarus, USA, Switzerland, Germany, South Korea, Russia, Po-

land, Ukraine, Moldova, Bulgaria, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Azerbaijan and Serbia. The Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Republic of Belarus is the official host of this annual event. Supporting organizations include UNICEF, Red Crescent International, the US Embassy Small Grants Program, and numerous Belarus and European corporate sponsors.

The youth will train as a team, under the direction of Lt. Leo Roy of the City of Manchester, New Hampshire Fire Department, to compete in international rescue and fire fighter competitions at the Rally. The program also conducts pre-trip briefings and has an orientation meeting with U.S. Embassy officials upon arrival in Minsk.
