Boston Univ. Women's Lacrosse Announces Class of 2018

BOSTON – The Boston University women's lacrosse team and head coach Liz Robertshaw announced the Class of 2018 on Thursday. Five of the freshmen will play in the midfield. The midfielders include Madison Learned. Learned's high school teammate, Mickenzie Larivee, will join Avery Donahoe at attack.

Mickenzie Larivee (Amherst, N.H./Souhegan) BEFORE BOSTON UNIVERSITY

Played four seasons at Souhegan High School, where she was teammates with incoming Terrier Madison Learned ... Was an Honorable Mention All-American and earned team MVP honors as a senior ... Received first-team all-state honors in all four years at Souhegan ... Was an All-American as a junior ... Named attacker of the year as a freshman and a junior ... Chosen as midfielder of the year as a sophomore ... Also played four years of varsity basketball, winning back-to-back state titles ... Played club for Granite State Elite Lacrosse.

Madison Learned (Amherst, N.H./Souhegan) BEFORE BOSTON UNIVERSITY

Four-year varsity starter at Souhegan High School, where she was teammates with incoming Terrier Mickenzie Larivee ... Was a US Lacrosse All-American as a senior after being named offensive player of the year and first-team all-state ... Was also first-team all-state as a junior ... Named midfielder of the year and was selected for the New Hampshire/Vermont state squad in 2013 ... Was second-team all-state and midfielder of the year as a sophomore ... Twice named to the Nashua Telegraph's first team ... Played club for Granite State Elite Lacrosse.

Division III All State Boys Lacrosse

William Towner, has been named to the NH All State Boys Lacrosse Team for the second year in a row, this year he joins the Second Team, his position is Attack. William was also a captain this year and lead the team with 49 goals and 26 assists during the regular season. William is a student at Trinity High School Manchester class of 2015 and the son of Will and Susan Towner Amherst.

Forest Nabs Second Straight NECC Rookie Of The Week Award
