Two evenly matched teams, playing similar possession styles, meant for an entertaining evening match postponed by the preceding 2 matches that went to Penalty Kicks. Delayed by more than an hour, the Sabers attacked from the whistle playing deep into the left corner where Ali Eweiss retrieved the ball and found a threatening pass centrally that must have worried the Bobcats. Early Saber progress continued, then slowly OR found some footing and retained the ball. Their passing attack was in good form, but the quick reactions of the SHS midfield and back 4 was inspired, shifting quickly to cover any quick change of attack and thwarting progress up the

Teigue Young again inspired strength on the few forays OR made into the Saber defensive ber confidence grew, and ball possession was in-

third. In the 26th minute Young was forced to dive left by OR midfielder Bryce Shultz, and he comfortably pushed the ball well wide of the post. That was soon followed by a Souhegan counter attack that ended with Young's counterpart Jon Dutka pushing a ball wide for a Saber corner. The ensuing corner found Sophomore Erik Richardson making his usual front post run, where he rose powerfully for an aerial header that clanged off the crossbar.

Although scoreless at the half, momentum seemingly even as well, the Sabers went into the half-time talk feeling powerful. The possession game was connecting, but team defending was smothering the Bobcats. The whistle sounded and the Bobcats used the original SHS kickoff tactic attempting to get in deep, but the effort was quickly swallowed up by Junior Josh Massa. Then the tide seem to go toward the Sabers, and possession deep in the OR defensive third was a key. A few probing attacks and long clearances without direction resulted in some sustained attacks for the Sabers. Then the break happened, with Jasper Jones getting on the ball deep on the right flank. His quick cross was chased down by a sprinting Devan Casey, who quickly smashed the ball over the keeper's head with his left foot from 16 yards. At 50 minutes, the Sabers lead 1-0. That is a lot of time for quality teams to both attack and defend!

An interesting thing happened though, as Sa-

creased. Any loss of possession was met with hounding team defensive efforts of double teams and fantastic organization, not allowing OR a shot for the next 20 minutes.

With 10 minutes to go, OR crafted a few passes that put their attackers into threatening positions, but goalkeeper Young was again up to the task with hands like glue. The Sabers then found more opportunities to add to the tally, coming close while again striking a post from close range. Ball possession continued to be in favor of SHS, and all were carefully counting down the seconds as OR threw more players up front.

Incredible leadership from the strongest crew of Seniors led the defending efforts in the waning moments of the game. Tough midfield tackling by Matt Hopfenspirger, incredible working pressure by Devan Casey, miles of running up and down the touch lines by Jasper Jones, sticky hands by Teigue Young, strength in marking and clearance by Pat Noble, and wonderful team organization by Reed Larson inspired the Sabers to

Eli Moksowitz of Souhegan Wins **Meet of Champions!**

Eli Moskowitz remained undefeated for the season as he raced to a strong first place finish in the field of 160 finishers at the New Hampshire Meet of Champions on Saturday at Nashua South High School! The meet featured the top high school teams and individuals from all of New Hampshire. Eli ran with the lead pack of about a dozen runners from the start. One by one runners dropped from the pack as it maintained a torrid pace despite the wind, rain and cold. With about 600 meters left in the race, the pack was reduced to Eli and Cam Daly of Interlakes High School. With about 400 meters to go, Eli surged ahead and was never seriously challenged again as he won by over 7 seconds with an excellent 15:32 time over the 5K course.

Saber Girls Race Well at the Meet of Champions!

The Souhegan Girls Cross Country Team, led by Madeleine Hunt's 11th place finish, placed 6th in the State at the Meet of Champions and earned the final New England team spot from New Hampshire! After finishing 3rd to Oyster River in the Division II Championships the previous weekend, Souhegan competed against the 19 best teams and individuals from Division I, II and III, and came up big, scoring 228 points and edging out Oyster River (239) to garner 6th place! Coe Brown won the meet handily with a low score of 36 points, followed by Bishop Guertin with 121 points. Following Madeleine (11th place, 18:49) across the line for the Sabers were Shannon Earley (49th, 19:55), Hannah Gillis (56th, 20:08), and Elise Lambert (61st, 20:17). Senior captain, Hannah Culver (85th, 20:53), Kate Bermingham (89th, 20:57) and Emmy Ehrenstein (119th, 21:48) also raced well for Souhegan. The New England Championships will be held at Wickham Park in Manchester, CT next Saturday.
