Church of Our Saviour to Host Harp Concert Following Annual Christmas Fair

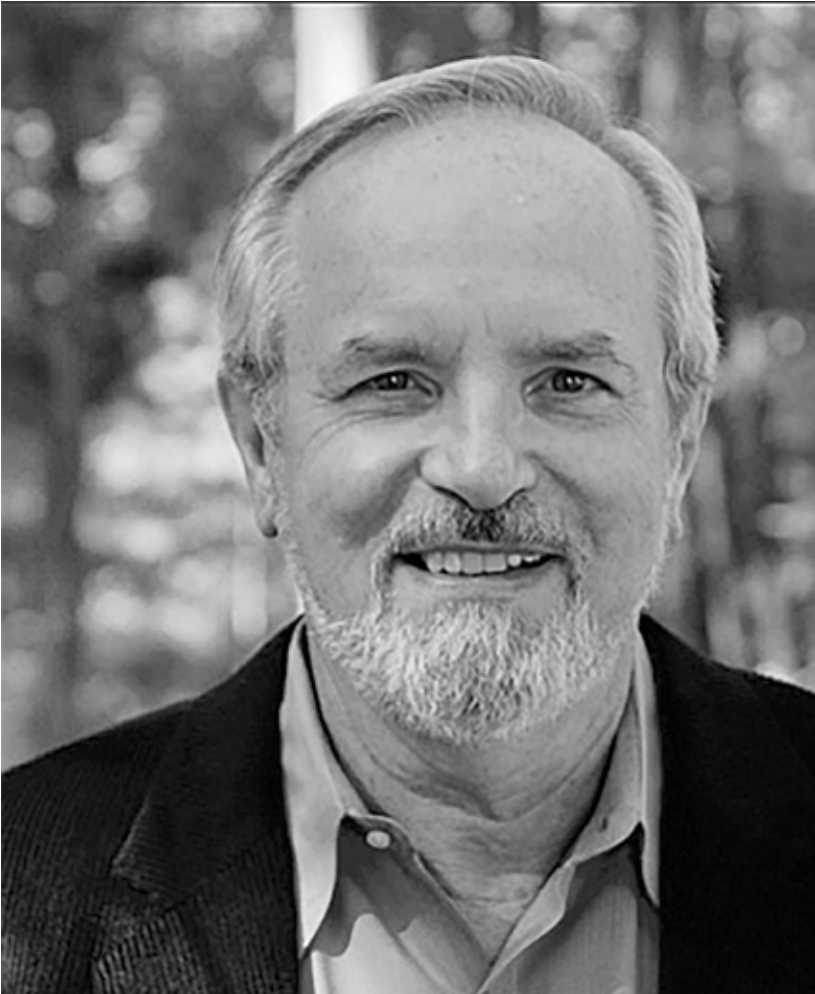

We live in times when essence of religion is misunderstood or marginalized. Another way of putting it: Religion has lost its soul. Emerson made the same complaint in 1835, and Emily Dickinson resolved it for herself in beautiful ways. We need a sense of the numinous, the meaningful and the mysterious, or else we lose touch with our humanity. We become like our machines. Our new century calls for a new kind of religiousness, a concrete spirituality that knows how to honor the natural world and the arts, as well as draw effectively and intelligently from the many spiritual traditions.

This presentation by renowned local author Thomas Moore offers specific ways to create such a deep religiousness in modern life, one that combines the holy and the sacred, the eternal and the worldly.

Thomas Moore is the author of the bestselling book Care of the Soul and twenty other books on soul and spirit. He writes regular columns for Resurgence, Spirituality & Health, and the Huffington Post. He has been a monk, a professor of religion and psychology, a musician and a psychotherapist. He lives in the Monadnock region with his wife, artist and kundalini yoga trainer Hari Kirin, and his daughter, recording and kirtan musician Ajeet Kaur.
