

Amherst Police Officer in 6th Year **Skating for CHaD**

AMHERST – On Saturday, April 11th, police officer and fire fighter hockey players from all parts of New Hampshire will join together in competition at the Verizon Wireless Arena for the 8th Annual CHaD Battle of the Badges Hockey Championship. Police officers and firefighters bring their passion and skills to the ice in this highly competitive game of "Good vs. Good" in support of the vital programs and services provided by the Children's Hospital at Dartmouth-Hitchcock. The event has raised more than one million dollars over the last seven years, and last year's event alone drew more than 7,000 spectators and raised \$233,000. The Amherst Police Depart-

ment's Officer Kevin Kelly will be skating for his sixth year in the event. Last year, Officer Kelly raised nearly \$3,000 in donations and scored a goal and an assist to help Team Police defeat Team Fire in a 5-4 victory. Each police officer and firefighter is tasked with raising at least \$1,500 in pledge support for the charity, and Officer Kelly is working diligently to break the \$3,000 mark this year. Carthage Coach Stephanie Ulicny Domin To Be Inducted Into Rhode Island Athletic Hall Of Fame the Rams' track & field and cross KINGSTON, RI – Carthage Col-

lege head women's cross country/ track and field coach Stephanie Domin will be inducted into the University of Rhode Island Athletics Hall of Fame on March 7, 2015 at the Quidnessett Country Club in North Kingstown, R.I. Later that afternoon, the hall of fame class will be honored at halftime of the men's basketball game versus Saint Joseph's.

"It is an honor to induct these fine representatives of University of Rhode Island Athletics into our Hall of Fame," said Thorr Bjorn, Director of Athletics. "It will be a special weekend for all of our inductees and I congratulate and celebrate all their achievements. Our Hall of Fame Weekend will be a great opportunity for our fans to welcome them back to URI to honor their induction.'

Domin, was the first Rhode Island cross country runner to qualify for the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championship, doing so in 1993. A three-time captain of country teams, she earned all-regional honors in cross country in 1993, as well as All-New England and All-Atlantic 10 Conference honors in both sports for all four years of her career. In 1991, Ulicny was named the RIAIAW Athlete of the Year and Scholar-Athlete Role Model and was the 1994 recipient of Rhodes Island's Elizabeth Holmes Award. She has been the head coach of the women's cross country and track & field teams at Carthage College since 1997.

Domin, the former Stephanie Ulicny, is a 1989 graduate of Milford Area High School where she was a track stand-out. While at MASH she was state champion in the one and two mile distances. She was also the New England Champion in the 3200m in her senior year.

Domin received her bachelor's in human development and counseling from the University of Rhode Island in 1993. She was a four-year letter winner in both cross country and track at Rhode Island and was

named All-Atlantic 10 Conference four times in cross country and three times in track as a distance runner, All-New England in both cross country and track and field four times and an NCAA Division I qualifier in cross country her se-

Domin served as a graduate assistant coach in both cross country and track at Loras College (1994-97), where she received her master's in athletic administration in 1997. In addition to her track and field duties, Domin has served as Carthage's head women's cross country coach since 2000 after three years (1997-99) as an assistant coach. Domin, her husband, Steve, the Carthage men's soccer coach, live in Pleasant Prairie, Wis., with their five-yearold son, Ty, and their three-year-old son, T.J.

Stephanie is the daughter of Steve and Helen Ulicny of Amherst.


