## Wilkins Destination Imagination Team Earns Trip to Globals

AMHERST – Wilkin's Destination Imagination (D.I.) team earned high honors at the New Hampshire State Tournament on March 28 and secured a spot in Global Finals-the largest creative thinking and problem solving competition in the world.

The T.I.G.H.A.M. Girls, which formed this year, finished in second place in their age level for their solution to this year's scientific challenge, "Making Waves". They now move onto the global competition in Knoxville, Tennessee on May 20-23 to compete along with more than 1,300 teams from 48 states and 30 countries.

'When they announced another team in third place, the girls realized they were top two and started yelling, 'We're going to glo-bals!" remembered team manager Terri Behm. "This year has been a crash course in all things D.I. We never dreamed we would make it this far our first time."

Team member Isabella D'Ambrosio feels like the tournament falling on her ninth birthday added a little

extra luck, but co-manager Ken D'Ambrosio said their strong teamwork and mix of strengths are what have
