Boston Saxophone Quartet Performs Duke Ellington: **Beyond Category Concert** 

AMHERST – The long awaited oncert of the Boston Saxophone as Music Director/Conductor of Quartet performing "Duke Ellington: Beyond Category Concert" is happening on Sunday, April 26 from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. in the Main Reading Room of the Amherst Town Library. Postponed due to snow twice this winter, we are looking forward to beautiful weather on April 26 (keep your fingers crossed) for this final program of the Sundays at 4 music series! The Boston Saxophone Quartet is a unique blend of musicians who have performed with the Boston Pops and Boston Symphony Orchestra and leading Broadway theaters throughout New England. The BSQ musicians are proficient on all the woodwinds including flute, clarinet, oboe, and bassoon, in addition to, of course, the saxophone. The four members of the BSQ are Tom Ferrante (soprano saxophone and bass clarinet), Greg Floor (alto saxophone and flute), Brent Beech (baritone saxophone and clarinet), and Peter Cokkinias (tenor saxophone and clarinet). The Library is grateful to be hosting these stellar professional musicians under our roof!

Sharing a dual career as an instrumentalist and conductor, Peter Cokkinias has conducted the Boston Ballet, Boston Pops, Springfield Symphony (MA), and the Atlantic Sinfonietta (NY). He has performed with the Boston Lyric Opera, Boston Ballet, and Cincinnati, Hartford, Pittsburgh, and Boston Symphony Orchestras. Presently,

the Metrowest Symphony Orchestra (MA), Professor at Berklee College of Music, and is a woodwind doubler at the North Shore Music Theater in Beverly (MA) and Colonial and Wang Theaters in Boston (MA). Tom Ferrante's performing career has been in the orchestras of the Colonial, Wang, and Schubert Theaters of Boston. Other credits include membership in the Herb Pomeroy Jazz Orchestra, The Viola Premier Saxophone Quartet, and the Greg Hopkins Big Band. A former Director of Bands for Waltham (MA) High School, Tom has been featured jazz clarinet soloist with the Boston Pops Orchestra for the past twenty seasons. Music is in the blood of renowned saxophonist Greg Floor. The clarinet was the instrument of choice for his grandfather and his father and his sister is a pianist. Greg graduated from the New England Conservatory in Boston where he received his Master of Music (Jazz Performance) under the instruction of virtuoso tenor saxophonist, Jerry Bergonzi. Greg was a featured soloist with the Boston Pops under the direction of the legendary John Williams. He has appeared in Jazz Festivals across the world. Brent Beech rounds out the quartet with his exuberant baritone saxophone and clarinet. He is an active woodwind performer now in the Boston area after his years in the Air Force band program. Brent completed undergraduate and Mas-



ters degrees as a classically trained clarinetist while performing professionally as a multi-instrumentalist specializing in woodwinds. His commercial work includes national tours with Maureen McGovern, John Pizzarelli as well as working with John Denver, Crystal Gayle, Bob Mintzer, Bob Newhart, Kenny Rodgers, Morton Gould, Paquito D'Rivera, Ed Shaunesey and many


