**Museum Passes – Passes to TWO new Museums!**

Passes to four museums are currently available at the library to library patrons. Three museums are free and one has a small co-pay. Three are in NH and one is in Boston. New this year passes to The Fells established in 1891 in Newbury, NH, which became the summer home of Secretary of State John Milton Hay are available now. Passes to the Children’s Museum in Dover, NH will be available in June.

**Children’s Museum of New Hampshire – NEW in June!!**

 Valid only for June, July, and August. One daily pass per day (co-pay)  
 NOTE: A pass admits a family (up to four people) into the museum at 50% off the cost of regular museum admission.

**SEE Science Center**

 Three family passes (no co-pay) (Without the library pass, the ticket price for ages three and up is \$8.)

**Museum of Fine Arts**

 Take away FLEX pass – one pass admits two adults (co-pay)  
 NOTE – there is a \$10 co-pay for EACH adult. Some special exhibits require a ticket with an additional charge. (Without the library pass, the ticket price is \$25 (\$23 for seniors).)

Passes may be checked out for one week. (Take away and FLEX passes are not returned.) Late returns will incur a \$5 fine. Please call the library at 673-7888, or stop by to reserve a pass. The Fells passes made possible by the generous donation of a library patron. Other passes are made possible through the fund raising efforts of the Friends of the Daland Memorial Library.

## Mont Vernon Historical Society News

### Museum to be OPEN Saturday, June 13

The Mont Vernon Historical Society Museum will be open on Saturday, June 13 from 1-4 p.m. The museum is located on the second floor of the Town Hall on Main Street. It opened twenty-five years ago in 1990. The historical society museums in Amherst and Milford will be open at the same time. All three museums will then be open the second Saturday July through October.

This year exhibits of note include the “Key to Mont Vernon” presented to returning WWI veteran Harold A Trow. Nine residents of Mont Vernon served in WWI. There will also be a display of old photos and newsletters from the Mont Vernon Village School, and a display of dresses worn by women in the mid-1900s. Ladies’ hats from this period are on display as well. In addition, this year a small portion of the actual tea thrown overboard during the 1773 Boston Tea Party will be on display. The story of how it came to the museum will be on hand.

Other exhibits of interest include the window and a bank of mail boxes from the post office that was once located behind the general store, Lamson Farm and Grand Hotel memorabilia, two quite rare antique Nutter clocks, a row of eight David Dutton clocks, and a quilt made by the King’s Daughters’ organization that includes a square that is over 150 years old. There is also a small library in the museum and a selection of historical society books, note cards, and T-shirts for sale in the museum’s store. There is no charge to visit the museum.
