SHS's Chris Brooks Honored by NHHC



40 Over 40, including Chris Brooks of Souhegan High School, are honored by the New Hampshire Humanities Council.

Chris Brooks, teacher at Souhegan High School, was one of 40 honorees chosen by the New Hampshire Humanities Council for their demonstration of what it means "to create, teach, lead, assist and encourage human understanding." The NHHC took the occasion of their 40th anniversary to celebrate 40 over 40 at an event held on June 16th at the Grappone Center in Concord.

Honorees were selected by a distinguished panel of state leaders after a comprehensive nomination process. The 40 included journalists, philanthropists, authors, filmmakers, local program organizers, civic leaders, volunteers and philanthropists. Among them were authors Dan Brown &

Tomie dePaola, filmmaker Ken Burns, and former US poet laureates Donald Hall and Charles Simic. Chris Brooks was one of three educators honored.

Here is an excerpt from the New Hampshire Humanities Council website (www.nhhc.org/): "A passionate educator, Chris Brooks empowers students to become betties, and workplaces. In 2009, he and his Souhegan students started HYPE (Hosting Young Philosophy Enthusiasts), a conference proposed to engage students from around the state in Socratic dialogue. That year, 110 students attended. This year, HYPE hosted 720 students from across NH and Maine. 'Everywhere I go,' his nominator said, 'when someone hears that our daughters went to Souhegan High School, a frequent question is, 'Did she have Chris Brooks for Ethics?' 'Yes!' I reply. 'And don't we wish every school in the nation had a Chris Brooks?'

Chris's teaching somehow relays the timelessness and urgency of asking essential human questions. He respects the capacities of every student to grasp the questions, and think through the consequences of embodying them. In the students' parlance, 'hero' and 'Chris Brooks' are synonyms, so this honor is an expression of gratitude that such a teacher returns to the public classroom year after year."

During opening remarks at the reception, Governor Maggie Hassan noted that humanities strength-
